Tell us a little bit about your background and experience:

I am a local Kootenai County resident and Lakeland graduate. In 1995 I enlisted in the US Army Reserves and ended my enlistment in 2003. I started as a Police Department Reserve Officer in January 2001 and was fortunate enough to be hired full time a few months later in July. During my 19 years, I have worked in the Patrol Division, Investigations, and back to Patrol where I was one of our Field Training Officers. While working these assignments, I handled every day patrol calls, person and property crimes cases, taught at the POST Academy, and trained our new hires upon their completion of academy or laterals on their arrival to the department.

What are your current duties and responsibilities:

My current duties and assignment started in the fall of 2017 at Coeur d'Alene High School as the School Resource Officer. As the School Resource Officer, my responsibility is to be in the high school during school hours and wear many different hats. However, my primary focus is on the safety and well-being of the student population which has grown each year I have been assigned. As a High School Resource Officer, I also have many athletic and extracurricular events to attend.

What is the most fulfilling aspect of your job, and why?

Without a doubt, it is the students. It's the most rewarding experience you can
