

In the early morning hours on May 5, 2015, Sergeant Greg Moore of the Coeur d'Alene Police Department was severely injured in an officer involved shooting in Coeur d'Alene, ID. He died later that day.

Sergeant Greg Moore was a highly respected member of the Coeur d'Alene Police Department who served his community for over sixteen years.

He was a mentor, a "Top Cop," and had served as a School Resource Officer. Only a few weeks prior to his death, he was awarded the Police Star for Bravery and Professionalism. He will be missed.





CALLS FOR SERVICE TRENDS TOTAL CALLS INCREASED 10% IN PAST TEN YEARS











SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER PROGRAM

The School Resource Officer program is a continuing effort between CDA Police and the Coeur d'Alene School District to provide for the safety and well being of students and school personnel on our campuses.

In 2015, each high school and middle school in the City of Coeur d'Alene had a School Resource Officer assigned to it. There is also a School Resource Officer assigned to the elementary schools.

North Idaho College also has a School Resource Officer assigned to the campus.

The presence of uniformed police officers in our schools allows for an array of police services to be provided to both students and staff including counseling and mentoring of students on a daily basis.

Officers interact with students through education and enforcement. They investigate cases, solve crime, and work with the Juvenile Court System on a regular basis.


