# MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COEUR D'ALENE, IDAHO, HELD AT COEUR D'ALENE CITY HALL, SEPTEMBER 16, 2003

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by Mayor Bloem.

**INVOCATION** was led by Pastor Tom Weadick, Vineyard Christian Fellowship

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**: Councilman Edinger led the pledge of allegiance.

**PRESENTATION – MUNICIPAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT:** City Clerk, Susan Weathers, reviewed the goals and objectives that the department developed to help the City meet the City Council's strategic categories.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

VARIOUS COMPLAINTS FOR 21ST AND CD'A AVE.: Roy Wargi, 2022 E. Cd'A Ave, voiced is discontent regarding several issues. On the east side of 21st St. between Lakeside Ave. and Sherman Ave. there is a fence that is only 2 feet from the curb and there is overgrown shrubbery. He stated that he had talked to Code Enforcement and received no response. He also complained that the crosswalks on Sherman on east side of street and Cd'A Ave. on east side of street are not where he would like to see the kids go into the street. He noted that the City took care of a tree removal situation, but there are still roots that need to be removed. Drivers are obeying the stop sign at 21st and Cd'A. He noted that the Police were there, showed up a couple of times, but cars still roll through and the City continues to do nothing. He feels that a child will get hurt because of the way people speed through there and he requested that the City take care of the traffic. Finally, cats are running around are getting into his garden and he can't do anything about it.

**NEW WELL SITE SEARCH:** Motion by Reid, seconded by Copstead to bring this item forward on the agenda. Motion carried. Steven James, JUB Engineering consultant, for the Water Department presented various possibilities for creating a new well site for the City. Motion by Reid, seconded by Wolfinger to authorize staff to proceed with drilling 3 test wells in the low-pressure zones and negotiate with the School District for Persons Field. Motion carried.

**PUBLIC HEARING – V-03-6 – VACATION OF PORTION OF 22ND STREET BETWEEN CD'A AVE. AND FERNAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:** Mayor Bloem announced the rules of order for this public hearing. Chris Bates, Project Manager, gave the staff report.

Mr. Bates reported that Jonathan Garner is requesting vacation of the portion of undeveloped 22nd Street from the north right-of-way of Coeur d'Alene Avenue to the southerly boundary of the Fernan Elementary School. This is an undeveloped sixty foot strip of ground that was never developed into a street and the construction of Fernan

Elementary School at its northerly development has eliminated any possibility or need for the road to be continued. There is no access to the school grounds at this location nor is one desired. The applicant has submitted a signed affidavit from the adjoining property owner to the west relinquishing any interest in any portion of the subject property.

28 notices by certified mail for this public hearing were sent with 5 responses being received - 0 in favor, 1 opposed, 4 neutral. Written comments were distributed for Council review.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Jonathan Garner, 6424 N. Davenport St., Dalton Gardens, stated that his first plan is to landscape the property and provide more parking for the tenants on the property adjacent to this parcel. His attention is to clean the property and would allow the School to continue to use some of the property for storage as they have been doing.

Motion by Reid, seconded by Wolfinger to approve the vacation of a portion of 22nd Street between Coeur d'Alene Avenue and Fernan Elementary School as requested. ROLL CALL: Copstead, No; Edinger, Aye; Goodlander, No; McEvers, Aye; Reid, Aye; Wolfinger, Aye. Motion carried.

**DRIVE CAREFULLY:** Councilman Wolfinger reminded residents that school is back in session, so please drive carefully and watch out for kids and please remember to reduce your speed in the speed zones around schools.

**LUNCH AT THE LIBRARY:** Councilman Goodlander announced that this Tuesday's Lunch at the Library will feature the Gurdy Hansen Memorial Trail.

**PARKS FOUNDATION**: Mayor Bloem asked that, anyone who would like to serve on this new commission, to please contact Doug Eastwood or City staff.

**APPOINTMENT - LAKE CITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION:** Motion by Copstead, seconded by Goodlander to re-appoint Brad Jordan to the Lake City Development Corporation. Motion carried.

**TUBBS HILL TRAIL PHASE II**: Motion by Copstead, seconded by Edinger to authorize staff to proceed with Phase II of the Tubbs Hill Trail improvements. Motion carried.

**LIGHTS AT RAMSEY FIELD**: Motion by Copstead, seconded by Goodlander that due to a lack of response to the advertisements for bids that staff be authorized to proceed with negotiating the installation of lights at Ramsey Field. Motion carried.

APPOINTMENT TO THE ANIMAL CONTROL ADVISORY BOARD OF THREE VETERINARIANS WHILE REQUIRING THE ATTEDANCE OF ONLY ONE VETERINARIAN AT A DANGEROUS DOG HEARING AND CLARIFYING WHAT CONSTITUTES A QUORUM AND AMENDING SECTION 6.05.215G(3) TO PROVIDE FOR CLARIFICATION OF THE MEMBERS NECESSARY TO REACH A DECISION AT A DANGEROUS DOG HEARING; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.
