Q & A with the New Mayor's Executive Assistant, Jo Anne Mateski

Tell us a little bit about your background and experience.



I spent 25 years of my professional career in administrative management and executive support in the Philippine government. I started as administrative staff at the Department of Social Welfare and Development and rose in the ranks to becoming the agency's Head Executive Assistant. I also served as Administrative Director for then Senator Benigno Aquino III at the Senate of the Philippines and continued to

be one of his trusted aides when he became the country's 15th President from 2010-2016 bravely going through all the papers for the President's attention before they arrived at his desk.

It was during my stint at the Office of the President when I was recognized and awarded as one of the 2015 Outstanding Public Officials and Employees (Dangal ng Bayan) by the Civil Service Commission. My last stint in government was as Chief of Staff to Senator Joel Villanueva during his first term from 2016-2022. I migrated to the US in 2022 and eventually moved to Post Falls, Idaho with my husband. *Continued on page 3.*



All Abilities Story Time

Join Miss Mandi on Mondays at 10:00 am through May 20, for a story time designed for kids, ages 3 - 8, with sensory and adaptive needs and their caregivers.



Designed to be welcoming to neurodivergence and disability, All Abilities Story Time uses a visual schedule. We will enjoy stories, music, movement, play, and sensory activities. Any child is welcome at this story time; stories and activities are typically at a preschool level. There will be noise-blocking headphones, weighted stuffed animals, and other sensory tools. Story time will be followed by an activity time, with all transitions announced.

What to expect during this story time: Attendees do not need to sit during the program. Children are free to stand or move around during the program as long as a safe environment is maintained for them and others in attendance. Children can participate with their voices in any way they like to. Attendees are welcome to arrive late, leave early, and leave the story time room any time they need a break.

Attendees can enjoy other activities of their choosing while listening to Miss Mandi read. The same schedule will be used each week so attendees will know what to expect. As Executive Assistant to the Mayor, my duties and responsibilities include preparing minutes of City Council meetings, Arts Commission, and Executive Team meetings; preparing agenda and meeting packets; writing routine press releases and correspondence for the Mayor; research and preparation for the Mayor's State of the City Address; processing of accounts payable for the Municipal Services Department; travel arrangements; preparing the monthly city calendar; facilitating the flow of information between the Mayor, City Council, City Administrator, and departments; and performing other tasks as assigned.

What do you like about the Coeur d'Alene area?

Aside from the pristine Lake Coeur d'Alene and beautiful landscapes, I believe the people are as beautiful and kind as the surroundings. I am always greeted with a friendly smile, and I really feel safe being here.

What about your family and interests?

My family are all in the Philippines, my siblings are in Manila while my parents are in Ilocos Province. I have a daughter who works as a licensed Interior Designer.

Besides my professional achievements, I am also passionate about holistic wellness. In the Philippines, I am a certified Ear Acupuncture Detoxification Specialist and have participated in volunteer work in poor communities. I also practice reiki healing, meditation, and yoga. These practices help me balance my physical and mental well-being so I can serve others with compassion and excellence.

Spring Start Up-Irrigation Backflow Assemblies

Landscape irrigation systems make watering lawns and gardens convenient and save time, but water that may be contaminated can potentially be back-siphoned or backflow into your drinking water.



To protect your drinking water from potential contamination by weed killers, pesticides, animal waste, or fertilizers, it is important to have an approved backflow prevention assembly/device properly installed on your landscape irrigation system.

It is equally important to be certain this backflow prevention assembly is performance tested annually to ensure that it is functioning properly. Annual backflow assembly testing is required by the State of Idaho and City ordinance. Irrigation backflow assemblies must be tested annually at spring irrigation start up and no later than July 1st of each calendar year.

This test, performed by a private - state licensed backflow assembly tester, verifies that the backflow prevention assembly is functioning properly. A landscape irrigation system not protected by an approved backflow prevention assembly, or protected by an assembly that is not functioning correctly, endangers the health of a household, neighborhood, and the entire community.
