REQUEST FOR ART QUALIFICATIONS

AWTF BIOGAS FLARE ART PROJECT

The City of Coeur d'Alene seeks to commission an artist or artist team to create an outdoor sculptural installation at the City's Advance Wastewater Treatment Facility. The Request for Qualifications (RFQ) is a call for artists to submit their qualifications for the City's consideration for an outdoor sculpture erected around the Advance Wastewater Treatment Facility (AWTF) Biogas Flare. Nestled alongside the Centennial Trail and the Spokane River is the Coeur d'Alene Advance Wastewater Treatment Facility. A publicly-owned treatment facility, the AWTF is subject to one of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) and the country's most restrictive effluent discharge requirements.

The artwork should be scheduled for installation in August of 2024.

There is no specific theme for the artwork other than the AWTF has requested that the final piece be safe, FUN, and appropriate for viewers of all ages.
