City Re-Opens 2018 Community Opportunity Grant

The City of Coeur d'Alene invites competitive grant proposals for projects that benefit low-to-moderate income people or neighborhoods, and/or promote job creation/economic development. Any individuals, profit or nonprofit organizations, business, or governmental agencies may apply for City of Coeur d'Alene Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program funds. Applications may be submitted for one and two plan year period(s) (Plan Year 2018 and Plan Year 2019) for independent programs/projects. Technical assistance and one-on-one grant application support is available.

Vehicle Prowling / Theft Prevention Tips

Everything is fair game to a thief, don't leave anything in sight. Please review the recommendations listed below—together, we can keep Coeur d'Alene a safe place to live.

- Always lock your car
- Don't leave bags, backpacks or containers in your car, it might attract the attention of a thief
- Park in well-lit areas
- If you hear an alarm, look to see if there is anything suspicious—if so, call 911
- If leaving valuables in your car, place the items in the trunk before you get to your location to avoid a thief seeing you lock up the valuables
- Disable the button in your car that opens the trunk from the inside
- Don't leave your purse in your car, even for a very quick stop
- Never leave your car running unattended
- Don't leave your windows rolled down even a little bit
- Don't attach a spare key to your vehicle
