Tell us a little bit about your education and experience: | developed an interest in computers back in high school. I bought my first computer in 1996 and a good friend coached me along until I was mostly selfsufficient. After I learned some of the basic troubleshooting skills, I decided to make a career change from grocery to technology. In 1998, I started working in Liberty Lake at a software support center where I honed my troubleshooting skills supporting Microsoft Windows, Office, and Microsoft games and hardware. I also worked at one of the local computer shops in Coeur d'Alene where I did more hands-on system building and troubleshooting. I stayed there until I was hired by the City of CdA in 2008.

# What are your current job responsibilities and how are they integral to the Police

**Department?** I install, maintain, troubleshoot, repair and upgrade desktop PCs, servers, laptops, incar computers and video systems, in-car network equipment, VOIP phones, software and peripherals. For all of public safety, we try to keep the computers and software running as well as possible — it's one less thing they need to worry about when they are on call.
