TIPS FOR CHILDREN!

If you see a gun, here are three things to do:

1. STOP. DO NOT TOUCH THE GUN!

It may not be real, but it might be, and it might be loaded.

2. LEAVE THE AREA!

Get away from the gun as fast as possible. If it's real you don't want to be around if someone else picks it up or starts to play with it.

3. TELL AN ADULT, NOW!

As fast as you can, tell your parents or some other adult you know. Your parents will know what to do.



TIPS FOR ADULTS!

You have three important jobs:

1. Educate your children about the dangers of guns.
2. Learn how to keep your own guns stored safely and out of the reach of children.
3. Teach your children that guns;

CAN AND DO KILL!

- Inquire about guns at your children's friend's house.
- Don't be shy about asking the parents of these friends if there are guns in the house and how they are stored.
- It's your child who could become an innocent victim of someone else's carelessness.
- Treat every firearm with respect...always as if it was loaded.
- Unload weapons when they are not in use.
- Keep all weapons locked securely in cabinets.
- Keep bullets locked away separately from the guns themselves.
- Never point a gun at anyone, never horseplay with weapons.
- Equip your guns with trigger locks.

Educate your children...Educate Yourself...Keep your kids alive.

MORE DON'TS

Drugs or drug paraphernalia:

If you find or come across discarded prescription drugs, drug paraphernalia, or anything that looks like drugs, **DON'T** touch or handle them. Tell your parent, teacher or an adult what you've found.



Strangers are not always evil looking:

Child molesters and abductors usually look like everyday people. **DON'T** talk to adults you do not know. Anytime you are approached by an adult you should check with a parent or trusted adult immediately.



To be safe, here are some very important tips. Remember them when dealing with people whom you don't know.

- **DON'T** talk to strangers.
- **DON'T** get in a car with a stranger.
- **DON'T** let a stranger touch you.
- Stay and play in well-lit and monitored places.
- Remember there is safety in numbers. Stay and play in the company of other kids. Never alone.
- Strangers who harm children, at first, look and act like everybody else. They try to get you to trust them.
- **DON'T** be fooled by their friendly talk and sweet smiles.
