The Mayor and Council of the City of Coeur d'Alene met in a regular session of said Council at the Coeur d'Alene City Library Community Room November 1, 2011 at 6:00 p.m., there being present upon roll call the following members:

**CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by Mayor Bloem.

**INVOCATION:** Invocation was led by Pastor Skip Lane, Hayden Friends Church.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** The pledge of allegiance was led by Councilman McEvers.

### **PRESENTATIONS:**

Sandi Bloem, Mayor

IRONMAN COMMUNITY FUND AND IRONMAN AWARDS: Ironman Race Director Mac Cavasar presented the Parks Department with a check in the amount of \$1,400 as the proceeds from the Kids Ironman Fun Run. He also presented the Police Officers and Firefighters Memorial Fund with a check in the amount of \$2,600 on behalf of the Ironman athletes' raffle. He noted that Ironman presented a \$10,000 check for the Kroc Center and \$15,000 was distributed to the volunteer groups and aid stations throughout the course. He also presented a check to the City in the amount of \$15,000 for the Community Fund Grant program. Mayor Bloem announced the recipients of the \$15,000 grant program.

STREET DEPARTMENT EFFICIENY REPORT AND 2011-2012 SNOW PLAN: Streets Superintendent Tim Martin, reminded the community that Leaf-Fest 2011 will begin November 14<sup>th</sup> starting south of Sherman and working north. He reviewed the snow plan which includes the "Name the Storm" contest that was conducted by the students at Bryan School. This year's theme is "berries". He noted that the Street Department's goal is 37 hours for a complete plow of the city, and plowing information is announced on KVNI, local TV, and the city's web site. He presented some winter tips on how citizens can help crews keep the streets open and plowed including removal of cars from the streets. He explained the cost of plowing residential streets is approximately \$.50/household for each plowing cycle. Mr. Martin reported that the Street Department works in partnership with the area's district highway departments, ITD, as well as

the City's Engineering Department, and other cities such as Hayden. Steve Roberge, Waste Management District Manager, presented the plan for closure of alleyways for garbage pickup during the winter months, which will be to continue to do alleyway pickup until the snow level prevents alleyway passage. In the event of alley garbage pickup being discontinued, they will notify the residents.

### **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Dennis Hinricksen, 946 E. Spruce Avenue, requested the City teach students the rules of the road, requested a street light at Spruce and 9<sup>th</sup>, and signalization at the intersections of Locust and 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Streets.

### **COUNCIL COMMENTS:**

<u>COUNCILMAN GOODLANDER</u>: Councilman Goodlander encouraged the residents to vote next Tuesday. Councilman Hassell also noted that absentee voting by mail requests deadline is Wednesday, Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>.

<u>COUNCILMAN MC EVERS</u>: Councilman McEvers described the Parking Commission's various responsibilities and invited interested citizens to attend their meetings at 3:00 p.m. at City Hall and possibly volunteer to serve on the committee.

**ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:** City Administrator Wendy Gabriel announced that kudos go to the Coeur d'Alene Parks Department and the Kootenai County Dog Park Association who held a dedication ceremony opening the city's second dog park. Now, in addition to "Central Bark" located on the west side of the city off of Atlas Road and Nez Perce this second dog park,

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located on the east side of the city at Cherry Hill Park, is now open. Two tree care workshops are scheduled for Friday, November 4<sup>th</sup>, at the Finch Arboretum in Spokane. The topics to be covered are tree pruning and tree species selection for landscape and community use. The preregistration deadline is November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Workshop and registration information can be obtained at www.communitycanopy.org or call the Coeur d'Alene Parks Department at 208-415-0415. The Coeur d'Alene Police Department and the city's Enough is Enough Committee would like to thank everyone who participated in the "Prescription Drug Turn-in Day" as part of the Drug Enforcement Agency's third National Pharmaceutical Drug Take Back Day, October 29<sup>th</sup>. During the week of November 7 – 11, 2011, Coeur d'Alene Police Department (CDAPD) personnel will be looking for abandoned vehicles. Vehicles in violation will be tagged for 48hour removal. If the vehicles are not moved in the allotted time, they will be towed. Monday, November 14, 2011 marks the start of the City of Coeur d'Alene annual leaf pick-up program. Please rake your leaves and pine needles about one foot away from the gutter/curb line to allow for water drainage. City crews and equipment are limited, so we need your help. Leaves will be picked up only once. Pick-up will start south of Sherman Avenue and move north. Completion is expected by Wednesday, November 23rd. If you have any questions or need additional information please check the website STREETS.CDAID.ORG or call the Street Maintenance Information line at 769-2233. The Coeur d'Alene Arts Commission is seeking artists for public art in three vehicular round-a-bouts in the "Education Corridor." It is anticipated that the public art will embody the area's diverse and rich history, the vibrant present, and the bright future. Information packets are available at City Hall, 710 E. Mullan Avenue, or online at www.cdaid.org. Artist proposals are due by 5:00 p.m., November 24, 2011. Government Way, Coeur d'Alene, ID, 83815, with Ada Loper, Secretary/Treasurer, hereinafter referred to as the "Developer," and the city of Coeur d'Alene, a municipal corporation and political subdivision of the state of Idaho, whose address is City Hall, 710 E. Mullan Avenue, Coeur d'Alene, ID 83814, hereinafter referred to as the "City";

WHEREAS, the City has approved the final subdivision plat of Landings at Waterford 6<sup>th</sup> Addition, a twenty (20) lot residential development, in Coeur d'Alene, situated in the Northwest 1/4 of Section 28, Township 51 North, Range 4 West, B.M., Kootenai County, Idaho; and

WHEREAS, the Developer completed the installation of certain public improvements in the noted subdivision as required by Title 16 of the Coeur d'Alene Municipal Code and is required to warrant and maintain the improvements for one year; NOW, THEREFORE,

### IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

The Developer agrees to maintain and warrant for a period of one year from the approval date of this agreement, the public improvements as shown on the construction plans entitled "The Landings At Waterford 7<sup>th</sup> Addition Record Drawings", signed and stamped by Ray Kimball, PE, # 11617, dated October 18, 2011, including but not limited to: sanitary sewer main, manholes, laterals and appurtenances, potable water main, laterals and appurtenances, fire hydrant assembly, concrete roll curb, stormwater drainage swales, drywells and appurtenances, concrete sidewalk and pedestrian ramps, asphalt pedestrian/bicycle path, street base rock and asphalt paving, street signage, and, monumentation as required under Title 16 of the Coeur d'Alene Municipal Code.

The Developer herewith delivers to the City, security in a form acceptable to the City, for the amount of Twenty Three Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$23,000.00) securing the obligation of the Developer to maintain and warrant the public subdivision improvements referred to herein. The security shall not be released until the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 2012. The City Inspector will conduct a final inspection prior to the release of the security to verify that all installed improvements are undamaged and free from defect. In the event that the improvements made by the Developer were not maintained or became defective during the period set forth above, the City may demand the funds represented by the security and use the proceeds to complete maintenance or repair of the improvements thereof. The Developer further agrees to be responsible for all costs of warranting and maintaining said improvements above the amount of the security given.

Owner's Reimbursement to the City: The Parties further agree that the City has utilized substantial staff time to prepare this agreement, which will benefit the Owner. The Parties further agree the City should be reimbursed a reasonable fee for its costs to prepare such agreement. The Parties further agree that such fee should be in the amount of Twenty Five and No/100 Dollars (\$25.00).

### **DECISION POINT:**

The City Council may wish to award the contract for the purchase of the 2012 Sewer Jet Truck to Sahlberg Equipment Company for the bid amount of \$161,712.26.

### **HISTORY:**

The City of Coeur d'Alene Wastewater Utility solicited bids for a 2012 Sewer Jet Truck to replace the aging existing 2000 Sewer Jet Truck. This equipment is vital to the efficient maintenance of the wastewater collection system and is used on a regular (almost daily) basis. The solicitation for bids was advertised in the Coeur d'Alene Press on October 17 and 24, 2011 and bids were publicly opened November 1, 2011.

### FINANCIAL ANALYSIS:

Funding for this equipment is budgeted in the approved FY 2011-2012 Wastewater budget. The low bid amount is less than the line item budgeted amount (Acct. # 031-058-4352-7515), therefore no additional funding is required.

### **PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS:**

Two (2) bids were received for the 2012 Sewer Jet Truck in response to the solicitation. The bid results are as follows:

- Western System Refuse & Street Equipment ......\$189,495.00
- Sahlberg Equipment Company......\$161,712.26

Both bids were reviewed by Wastewater staff and deemed responsible and responsive. The Wastewater Utility has previously and satisfactorily purchased equipment from Sahlberg Equipment.

### RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the bid and recommend that the Coeur d'Alene City Council award the purchase of a 2012 Sewer Jet Truck from **Sahlberg Equipment Company for the bid amount of \$161,712.26**

- ❖ The Coeur d'Alene Downtown Association reserves the right to cancel the carriage rides if at any time practices detrimental to the general well being of the Downtown are brought to the notice of, and so voted upon by, the Downtown Board of Directors (or Executive Board).

We believe these carriage rides will enhance the spirit of the holiday season Downtown.
