MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COEUR D'ALENE, IDAHO, HELD AT THE LIBRARY COMMUNITY ROOM

August 20, 2013

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Bloem called the meeting to order.

INVOCATION: Led by Pastor Joe Tuttle, Heart of the City Church

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Councilman Kennedy led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor asked that Wastewater Treatment Superintendent Sid Fredrickson introduce new staff members Mike Becker, Utility Project Manager and Rob Grytness, Collection Operator.

PRESENTATION: POLICE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS – Chief Longo stated that there is currently one officer in each Middle School and High School that are specifically trained in school issues including drug abuse. After the Sandy Hook incident, the Police Department and School District 271 agreed it was important to replace the Canfield Middle School Resource Officer. Captain Clark explained that the current contract with the School District includes six Resource Officers, which includes the Canfield Middle School position (with 50% of the position funded by the District). The officers are stopping by the elementary schools as well. The District has agreed to cover officer overtime expenses related to the coverage of school events. Councilman Goodlander stated that she has heard that the officer's also provide a good outlet for kids to discuss problems. Captain Clark stated that officers are accessible since they are on campus and they also teach classes which build relationships. Chief Longo clarified that the Resource Officers are utilized in patrol during the summer.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

FRONT AVENUE:

Charlie Miller, Coeur d'Alene, spoke in support of the closure of Front Avenue from 2nd to 3rd on behalf of the Centennial Trail Commission. He stated that he and the Commission had not seen a plan, and asked that they have input into the final design.

Brenda Garcia, Coeur d'Alene, stated she is against the closure of Front Avenue. She believes the roadway is needed by the Resort and the boat launch and believes this will cause gridlock on Sherman. She believes the merchants in the area would be concerned with the closure and is concerned about the costs. She asked the Council to consider if this is needed and what is gained by it.

COUNCIL ANNOUNCEMENTS:

<u>Councilman Gookin</u> stated that he was contacted regarding vandalism at McEuen. Upon speaking with the Parks Director, he found out that there was some spray-paint vandalism and those responsible were caught and sentenced to community service. He recommended that people attend the Democratic Lunches as they are currently providing speakers regarding Human Rights. The lunches are held every Friday at noon at the Iron Horse Restaurant.

<u>Councilman Goodlander</u> stated that she took a tour of McEuen Park last week and wanted to say it is a remarkable-sized park and that the playground equipment is in place. Additionally, there are many people using the trail at the base of Tubbs Hill.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: City Administrator Wendy Gabriel stated that Specialized Needs Recreation marked the end of summer last week with a luau party. She expressed thanks to volunteers, as without the volunteers this event, and the SNR program as a whole, would not

be possible. The enormously popular City Park Concert Series is coming to a close this Sunday with the last concert of the season. Men in the Making will provide Shake, Rattle & Show! These concerts in the park are held every Sunday during the summer months, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Rotary Lakeside Bandshell in CDA City Park. Bring your lawn chairs and blankets and come out for a great time and great music! After 35 years of faithful service to the City of Coeur d'Alene, Doug Eastwood will be retiring as the City's Parks Director. The City of Coeur d'Alene will be hosting a Farewell Open House on Friday, August 23rd, from 12:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Library Community Room, and citizens are invited to stop by and thank Doug for his dedicated service. For more information please call 415-0415. The City of Coeur d'Alene Arts Commission is accepting nominations for the 18th Annual Mayor's Awards in the Arts. Nominations may be submitted by art organizations, individuals, or businesses, and must be received by September 5th. The Mayor's Awards in the Arts are presented by the Coeur d'Alene Arts Commission and the City of Coeur d'Alene to recognize and encourage excellence in the arts and to stimulate and support awareness of the arts throughout the City. Nominees may be businesses, organizations, or individuals who have, through distinguished service or creative accomplishment, made a significant contribution to the arts in Coeur d'Alene. Ms. Gabriel congratulated Deputy Fire Chief Glenn Lauper for being asked to serve on the International Association of Arson Investigators Fire Investigations Standards Committee. Service on this committee is a direct reflection of Deputy Chief Lauper's outstanding reputation as one of the premiere arson investigators in the country. She stated that the Front Avenue design was discussed on January 10, 2013, which included the approval of the design of limited access to increase linkages and protect view corridors. The limited access allows for emergency access, delivery vehicles, and bus loading and unloading. On January 11, 2013 and January 16, 2013 the Coeur d'Alene Press wrote articles regarding the limited access design concept.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the same be spread upon the Minutes of this meeting and published in two (2) issues of the Coeur d'Alene Press, seven (7) days apart, to be published on August 28, 2013 and September 4, 2013.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a Public Hearing on the Budget be held on the 17th day of September, 2013 at the hour of 6:00 o'clock p.m. on said day, at which time any interested person may appear and show cause, if any he has, why the proposed amended Budget should or should not be adopted.

STAFF REPORT: Mr. Tymesen stated that the City is nearing the end of the fiscal year and that it is time to bring forward an amendment. He clarified that the request tonight is to set a public hearing and that this is the second amendment for the fiscal year. Mr. Tymesen presented the amendment highlights to include that expenses are being covered with cash, building permit revenues are increasing beyond estimates, federal grants have been received, lowering of earlier estimated standpipe rent income to the general fund as the water fund is now overseeing the program, drug task force expenses, decreased interest earnings, and an increase in the sale of surplus items. He clarified that the line item entitled "holiday pay" has recently be renegotiated with the Police Association. This renegotiation causes two years' worth of holiday pay to be paid out in one fiscal year; however, less will be paid out next year.

Mr. Tymesen clarified that the September 17, 2013 hearing will be the date the Council will be asked to approve the amendment. Councilman Gookin asked if the amendment could be amended prior to the hearing date. Mr. Tymesen stated that he hoped not. Councilman Gookin asked where the \$85,000 from the County was in the amendment. Mr. Tymesen stated that it was under other income.

MOTION: Motion by Goodlander, seconded by McEvers to adopt Resolution 13-046 and the setting of a public hearing for September 17, 2013.

FRONT STREET – 2ND TO 3RD STREET PLAN

STAFF REPORT: City Engineer Gordon Dobler presented the modeling results, design, and funding options for the Front Avenue limited access closure. He stated that there were various iterations of design discussed. He clarified that there would continue to be access to the docks and loading bay's to the Resort and that removable ballard's would be installed for the limited access. The design allows for connectivity for bicycles and pedestrians and eliminates the conflicts with the driveway and vehicular site visibility problems. He reviewed the traffic study findings that found that right turn only lane on Sherman to 3rd Street will increase capacity and will improve the 3rd and Front intersection.

Councilman Kennedy asked Mr. Dobler to clarify the effect the design had on the rating of the intersections. Mr. Dobler stated that when they revised the design to re-open 4th Street, none of the existing ratings were downgraded. Due to the ability to model designs, he was able to determine if changes would affect the ratings. The idea to do two-way traffic on Third Street from Front Avenue to Lakeside Avenue brought the level of service up for left turns at Sherman Avenue and 3rd Street. Councilman Goodlander asked if Third Street to Lakeside Avenue will have left turn capabilities. Mr. Dobler stated that it would and clarified that there will be left turns allowed at Sherman Avenue. Councilman Goodlander stated that she is concerned that the one lane north or south from Lakeside Avenue would hold up traffic with left turn movements. Mr. Dobler stated that 4th Street is still open and with two-way traffic on 3rd Street from Front to Lakeside Avenues it balances out. Councilman Goodlander clarified that it will be like the current 2nd Street design. The additional lane on Sherman Avenue will be completed with the removal of parking in front of The Shops. Mr.

Dobler stated that he talked with the Resort and they were amenable to the change. Councilman Gookin asked about the design for the intersection on 3rd Street where the two southbound lanes end at Lakeside Avenue. Mr. Dobler explained that the right lane will be a right turn only and the left lane will flow through. The design moves the lane to the east to accommodate the flow, and the right lane will look at a curb, not oncoming traffic. This will give a visual clue that the lane does not continue. Councilman Gookin asked about the plan for Fourth Street. Mr. Dobler stated that it could be looked at based on the outcome of the Third Street flows. The Mayor asked if travel westbound on Lakeside Avenue would change. Mr. Dobler clarified that it does not change and that five parking spots will be lost on Third Street.

Councilman Edinger asked if there would be enough room for right turns from the boat launch. Mr. Dobler stated that the design removes some of the bulb out at the southwest corner and moves the through lane to widen it for this type of movement. He clarified that Lakeside provides a direct route to the four corners and Northwest Boulevard with less stops and might be a preferred route. Councilman Goodlander stated that the left turn lane (east bound) from Northwest Boulevard only has room for three cars and she is concerned about traffic backing up. Mr. Dobler stated that he believes the boat traffic will come directly down Sherman Avenue and use the new turn lane. Councilman Edinger asked how much the project will cost.

Councilman Kennedy reiterated that the Council did vote 5-1 on the restricted access of this area in January and that this was not a staff-determined direction. Mr. Dobler stated that this is an opportunity to solve the pedestrian/vehicular conflict. Councilman McEvers stated that 6th Street will be an entrance and an exit and that most of the boat traffic will use 3rd Street. He felt that it looked weird; however, believes the flow will change because of the exits from the parking at 6th Street. Mr. Dobler clarified that Front Avenue improvements are included in the LID and the additional costs would be the additional work on 3rd Street at a cost of \$150,000 to \$200,000 and that it could be paid for out of the project contingency fund. Councilman Goodlander clarified that there is also a vehicular entrance at Third Street. Mr. Dobler stated that the flow of the parking sends traffic out at 6th Street.

Councilman Kennedy stated that earlier discussions included contributions from the abutting land owner; however, that is not the current case. He believes that there is no reason not to do this project, as the only change since January is that the Hagadone Corporation will not be putting their own funds in to beautify this area. Mr. Dobler reiterated that the problems at the Front and 3rd Street intersection cannot be easily solved. Councilman Edinger asked if there were any studies or information demonstrating accidents or injuries at the intersection. Mr. Gordon stated that he could get the accident reports. Councilman Adams asked if the project can still be funded without any contributions from the Hagadone Corporation. Mr. Dobler clarified that with the Stormwater Utility picking up cost of the storm drain along 3rd Street, the contingency fund can handle this expense. The Mayor clarified that the Hagadone Corporation was still included in the LID.

MOTION: Motion by Kennedy, seconded by McEvers to accept the Front Street concept and funding sources and direct staff to move forward with design.

DISCUSSION: Councilman Kennedy clarified that there were previous discussions about doing something more elaborate with the Hagadone Corporation but the safety considerations are still a

priority and he believes that vehicular traffic will adapt. He recalls many conversations during the Thursday morning project meetings with the design group regarding the safety of that intersection. Councilman Goodlander stated that she will vote against the motion and believes it will cause bottlenecks that are unnecessary and that there are other options. She stated that she is concerned that the City did not talk with other downtown business owners. Councilman Kennedy stated that there were discussions with groups prior to the January meeting. Councilman Adams asked if the plan came through the Pedestrian/Bike Committee. Mr. Dobler stated that he is confident that Mr. Eastwood and/or Mr. McCully have talked with the committee. Ms. Gabriel stated that as they firm up the design they will be sure to provide it to the committee.

Councilman Adams asked what the completion date would be. Mr. Dobler stated that it would be completed in two phases, with Third Street work done with Front Avenue, and the piece on Front Avenue between 2nd and 3rd Streets done in the spring. Councilman Gookin asked if the funding from the Hagadone Corporation could be requested at a later date. Mr. Dobler believes there is a window before we build for them to participate. Councilman Gookin stated that he does have traffic flow concerns. Councilman McEvers said that he has faith in the City Engineer and that people learn to drive alternative routes, as in the example of the roundabouts. Additionally, he believes that safety is the most important factor. Councilman Kennedy stated that it is no secret that the Resort would like to add rooms above the building across the street, which might be good timing for them to add to the beautification of the project. Currently, the City has to deal with the safety and should do the right thing now. Councilman Edinger called for question. Motion Carried.

ROLL CALL: Gookin No; Kennedy Aye; Edinger No; Adams Aye; McEvers Aye; Goodlander No. Mayor Bloem broke the tie with an affirmative vote. **Motion Carried**.

RESOLUTION 13-047

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF COEUR D'ALENE, KOOTENAI COUNTY, IDAHO AUTHORIZING AN ADDENDUM TO THE LEASE AGREEMENT WITH THE ELEVENTH STREET DOCK OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.

STAFF REPORT: Ms. Gabriel stated that the City currently leases space to the Eleventh Street Dock Owners Association which needs to be amended to include the recent dock assignment to the City fire vessel and the addition of temporary dock moorage space for other emergency vehicles and the clarification that an electronic access code will be provided.

MOTION: Motion by Edinger, seconded by Gookin to adopt Resolution 13-047.

ROLL CALL: Gookin Aye; Kennedy Aye; Edinger Aye; Adams Aye; McEvers Aye; Goodlander Aye. **Motion carried.**

RECESS: The Mayor called for a 5-minute recess at 7:41 p.m. The meeting resumed at 7:45 p.m.

LID 150- FINAL ASSESSMENT ROLL FOR THE GOVERNMENT WAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

STAFF REPORT: Mr. Dobler stated there were three action items tonight to accept the final assessment, determine the disposition of protest and to adopt an Ordinance. He explained that the majority of the costs were associated with water line installations. He stated that each of the owners was notified of the preliminary assessments and that the final costs came in below the original preliminary assessments. The total LID assessment is \$180,024 and no general funds were involved in this LID. Councilman Gookin asked who previously provided the water/sewer on Government way prior to the project. Mr. Dobler stated that there were some septic tanks and water came from the City of Dalton. Councilman McEvers asked if this project increased the property values. Mr. Dobler stated that he assumed it would as they now have adequate fire service.

Mr. Dobler read the two protests to the LID. He stated that the Leo Trust was a larger parcel. There was notice send to this property and the assessment has gone down from the preliminary assessment. There was some partial access during the project; however, a roadway project like this one cannot be built without some traffic impacts. The interest rate to finance the LID assessment will be 4% over ten years. Councilman McEvers asked if there had been conversation with the property owners during the project. Mr. Dobler stated that he had not specifically talked to the person who wrote the protest letter; however, there was notice sent to the property owners and public meetings were held. He recommends denial of the Leo Trust protest.

Mr. Dobler stated that the Castellanos parcel assessment had been decreased from the preliminary assessment. The preliminary assessment was \$13,329 with the final being \$10,542, so he would recommend denial of this protest. Mr. Dobler clarified that the City did buy property along Government Way and that it did not go to condemnation on any parcel. He stated that the road project went well and that JUB Engineering staff had communicated with the property owners throughout the project. Councilman McEvers stated that he was concerned that the property owner might not understand the project and process and asked that Mr. Dobler talk to them. Mr. Dobler stated that the project provides water and sewer that they did not have access to previously. Councilman Edinger stated that during construction he had a business owner contact him with problems and received feedback thereafter that they were happy with the end results. Councilman Goodlander recalled that the City did provide the property owners with substantial savings and provide value to the property owners and asked Mr. Dobler to clarify how the savings was achieved. Mr. Dobler stated that the City partnered with the City of Hayden to install the sewer line and the costs were absorbed by the Wastewater Utility and not passed along to the property owners.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Mayor Bloem called for public comments with none being received.

MOTION: Motion by Kennedy, seconded by McEvers to deny the written protest submitted by *Edgar and Nelly Castellanos*. **Motion Carried**.

MOTION: Motion by Kennedy, seconded by McEvers to deny the written protest submitted by *Leo J. Lee Trust.* **Motion Carried**.

SUBJECT: Approval of Change Orders No. 1 and No. 2 – 2013 Open Trench Project.

DECISION POINT:

The City Council may wish to approve Change Orders No. 1 and No. 2 for a total of \$4,210.36 to amend the Agreement between the City of Coeur d'Alene and MDM Construction, Inc. for the construction of the 2013 Open Trench Project. Approval of the change orders will increase the total contract amount of the Agreement from \$355,650.00 to \$359,860.36.

HISTORY:

Construction of the 2013 Open Trench project commenced April 22, 2013 and involved the installation of 850 L.F. of new 8 inch sewer main within Fernan Lake Road, the re-routing of 14 residential sewer services, abandonment of the existing defective sewer main and associated restoration work within the Fernan Lake Terrace subdivision. MDM Construction, Inc. constructed the project and achieved substantial completion on July 3, 2013.

PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS:

Change Order No. 1 (\$3,641.62) is the extra cost to modify the residential lift station dry well and pump appurtenances installed at 2914 Fernan Court. These modifications were necessary due to the required extra depth of the lift station when the service lateral for this residence was discovered to be approximately 3 feet deeper than anticipated.

Change Order No. 2 (\$568.74) is the total of 1) additional work items and changes in the work and 2) the adjustment of the final quantities of bid items for the project.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS:

Approval of these change orders will increase the contract amount by a total of \$4,210.36. Funding for these change orders will come from the approved 2012-2013 City of Coeur D'Alene Wastewater Operating Fund budget. Funds have been budgeted and are available in account # 031-022-4352-7901.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of Change Orders No.1 and No. 2, a total cost increase of \$4,210.36 to the City's agreement with MDM Construction, Inc. for a total construction amount of \$359,291.62.

SUBJECT: Request by Bob Erickson, 3982 N Herbs Lane (Nettleton Gulch) for Service Outside City

Limits.

DECISION POINT:

Water Department Staff requests Council determination as to whether Mr. Bob Erickson of 3982 N Herbs Lane meets the exceptions to the Policy for Water Service Outside City Limits and the Policy Amendment adopted by resolution 05-003.

HISTORY:

Mr. Bob Erickson of 3982 N Herbs Lane approached Water Department staff in 2012 to apply for water service due to a failing well. Mr. Erickson was informed that as his property was currently outside of city limits, unless there was a prior right through Idaho Water, he could not be granted a service unless he were to annex into the city. Unfortunately, his property is not contiguous to the city limits so annexation would not be possible unless he were to gain frontage adjacent to the city limits. Mr. Erickson was also encouraged to use the city's Project Review process to gather required information and potential fees associated with annexation. Mr. Erickson ultimately was not able to acquire frontage to allow annexation. With the serious lack of ground water recharge this summer, his well is currently not able to maintain sufficient production to provide the absolute essential needs of his single family dwelling.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS:

If Mr. Erickson's application for service is approved by Council, he will be required to pay capitalization fees of \$2,157.00, standard hookup fees of \$1,930.00, an asphalt patching fee of \$950.00 and the MXU fee of \$130.00. The grand total of fees due to the Water Department would then be \$5,167.00. If solid rock is encountered, there may be some additional charges for special equipment if needed. This will provide service to his property line. Mr. Erickson will then be responsible for installation of the service from the meter box to his residence.

PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS:

Installation of the single service to Mr. Erickson's property will not impact the water system in the area as it can adequately serve the additional capacity. However, there will be a pressure issue for Mr. Erickson to deal with. The elevation of his current dwelling is well above the maximum service elevation of the General Zone. Unfortunately, this is the only main he has direct access to. In order to provide adequate pressure to the dwelling, a private booster pump system will be required. It will be up to Mr. Erickson to install and maintain this system. Mr. Erickson would also be required to waive any opposition to future annexation and convey all water rights associated with the property to the city as a condition of service.

DECISION POINT/RECOMMENDATION:

Staff requests that City Council determine whether Mr. Bob Erickson of 3982 N Herbs Lane meets the exceptions to the Policy for Water Service Outside City Limits and the Policy Amendment adopted by resolution 05-003.

POLICY: WATER SERVICE OUTSIDE CITY LIMITS

Goals:

To the extent possible it is the intention of this policy to:

- Limit new water service outside City limits to those properties that have a grandfathered/vested right to water service created by, monetary participation by the owner or a predecessor in interest, in construction of the main that would provide service to the property.
- Require qualifying properties to annex if possible or require the owner to consent to future annexation.
- Limit those properties outside City limits qualifying for water service to one residential (single family residence, 3/4" meter) hook up for each parcel/lot existing at the time the property qualified to receive water service.
- Ensure the integrity of City boundaries.
- Minimize expenses for the City Water Dept. in upgrading facilities solely serving properties outside City limits.
- Ensure that the quality and quantity of City water service for City residents is not diminished by providing new water service outside City limits.
- Require the party seeking service to establish a right to the service.

Policy:

- 1. <u>Annexation.</u> A party seeking water service for a parcel outside City limits must annex into the City prior to receiving water service if the parcel is contiguous to the City limits. The party seeking annexation is responsible for all costs and fees associated with the annexation of their parcel.
- 2. <u>Service Outside City Limits:</u> If the party seeking water service cannot satisfy the annexation requirement, the party may be entitled to one residential hook up for a single family residence (3/4 inch meter) if they can prove by a preponderance of the evidence that they meet all of the following conditions as well as one of the exceptions listed below in section 3:
 - A. The parcel or lot abuts a city water service main to which another service line can reasonably be connected; and
 - B. The City's water service to other customers will not be reduced below adopted standards if the requested water service is provided; and
 - C. The property owner signs an agreement consenting to subsequent annexation by the City at the City's discretion; and

- D. The property owner agrees, in writing, to convey, without cost, all water rights attached to the parcel to the City upon request.
- 3. <u>Exceptions:</u> If the party seeking water service meets the conditions in section 2 above, they may be entitled to water service if they can prove by a preponderance of the evidence that they meet one of the following exceptions:
 - A. <u>Approved Subdivisions</u>: Each originally platted lot in the following subdivisions is entitled to one residential (3/4" meter) connection. If the lot, as originally platted has been further subdivided, the connection will be given to the first party who seeks service and meets the requirements of this policy.
 - i. Approved Subdivision list:
 - a. Ponderosa Park.
 - b. Ponderosa Terrace.
 - c. Springview Terrace 1st addition.
 - d. Les James Subdivision.
 - e. Sky Blue Acres.
 - f. Aqua Terrace.
 - g. Nob Hill.
 - h. Rivercal Subdivision.
 - i. Morse Subdivision.
 - i. Stanley Hill Terrace.
 - B. Existing Residence with Failing Water Service: The owner of a parcel with an existing residence will be allowed one residential connection (3/4" meter) if the owner can prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the parcel's current water service is failing for reasons outside the parcel owner's control and there is no reasonable cost effective alternative to seeking City water service.
 - C. Other Qualifying Parcels: Owners of parcels not meeting any of the other exceptions listed in this section may be allowed one residential connection (3/4" meter) if they can prove, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the parcel for which service is being sought has a grandfathered right to water service. In order to establish that the parcel has a grandfathered right the owner must establish that the City or one of its predecessors specifically agreed, in writing, to provide water service to the parcel. This may be established by showing that the developer of the lot had a written agreement with the City or its predecessor to provide water to the lot in question or by establishing that the developer of the lot participated in the funding of the water main extension to the lot. It is not sufficient to merely establish that the lot is within an area where service would have been provided by the City under a previous policy or by one of its predecessors.

AMENDMENT TO THE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES RESPECTING THE WATER SERVICE AREA AND MAIN EXTENSIONS OUTSIDE CITY OF COEUR D'ALENE LIMITS

It continues to be the policy of the City of Coeur d'Alene to provide no water main extensions within the Ultimate Service Boundary until such time as the affected property or properties to be served have been annexed to the City, except as provided in Exhibit B to Resolution 82-61 and this amendment.

1. Additional Exceptions.

In addition to compliance with all of the City of Coeur d'Alene policies and procedures respecting connection to the City's water service for parcels outside the City limits of the City of Coeur d'Alene, the City will allow one residential water hookup (3/4 inch meter) to an existing residence not otherwise eligible to receive water service from the City of Coeur d'Alene if the City has adequate water resources to provide the service and if the City Council finds to its satisfaction that:

- a. The parcel to be serviced is not contiguous to the City boundary and cannot be annexed at the time of the request; and
- b. The parcel abuts a city water service main to which another service line can reasonably be connected; and
- c. The parcel's current water service is failing for reasons not within the parcel owner's control and there are no reasonable cost effective alternatives to seeking water service from the City; and
- d. The parcel owner signs a document evidencing consent to subsequent annexation by the City of Coeur d'Alene at such time the annexation is convenient for the City.
- e. The parcel owner agrees to transfer any water rights, at his or her expense, to the City upon request.

- 2. That all costs and fees for connecting to and providing water service including but not limited to plumbing costs, connection fees (i.e., capitalization fees), hookup fees, excavation cost and fees shall be borne by the Owners and no cost whatsoever shall accrue to the City of Coeur d'Alene for the provision of such water service.
 - 3. That the connection to the City's water service shall be done to City specifications.



AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2013" APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$77,853,494 TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF COEUR D'ALENE FOR SAID YEAR; LEVYING A SUFFICIENT TAX UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN SAID CITY FOR GENERAL REVENUE PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATION IS MADE; LEVYING SPECIAL TAXES UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY WITH SAID CITY FOR SPECIAL REVENUE PURPOSES WITHIN THE LIMITS OF SAID CITY OF COEUR D'ALENE, IDAHO; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Coeur d'Alene, Kootenai County, Idaho:

Section 1

That the sum of \$77,853,494 be and the same is hereby appropriated to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of Coeur d'Alene, Kootenai County, Idaho, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2013.

Section 3

That a General Levy of \$16,773,620 on all taxable property within the City of Coeur d'Alene be and the same is hereby levied for general revenue purposes for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2013.

Section 4

That a Special Levy upon all taxable property within the limits of the City of Coeur d'Alene in the amount of \$2,485,065 is hereby levied for special revenue purposes for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2013.

Section 5

The provisions of this ordinance are severable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words or parts of this ordinance or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and if such person or circumstance to which the ordinance or part thereof is held inapplicable had been specifically exempt there from.

Section 6

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage, approval and publication in one (1) issue of the Coeur d'Alene Press, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of Coeur d'Alene and the official newspaper thereof.

Item 1 Approval of Change Orders No. 1 and No. 2 to the 2013 Open Trench Project Consent Calendar

James Remitz, Capital Program Manager, presented a request for Council approval of Change Orders No. 1 and No. 2, for a total cost increase of \$4,210.36 to the city's agreement with MDM Construction, Inc. for the 2013 Open Trench Project. Approval of the change orders will increase the total contract amount from \$355,650.00 to \$359,860.36.

Mr. Remitz stated in his staff report that Change Order No. 1 (\$3,641.62) is the extra cost to modify the residential lift station dry well and pump appurtenances installed at 2914 Fernan Court. The modifications were necessary due to the required extra depth of the lift station when the service lateral for this residence was discovered to be approximately 3 feet deeper than anticipated. Change Order No. 2 (\$558.74) is the total of one additional work item and changes in the work and the adjustment of the final quantities of bid items for the project. Funding for the changes would come from the approved 2012-2013 Wastewater Operating Fund budget.

Councilman Gookin commented that he hasn't heard anything from any of the residents in a long time and so he assumes that everyone is happy. Mr. Remitz said that they are still working with some people on landscaping, seeding, and sodding of their yards. He explained that Wastewater will take care of it, outside of the contract, just to satisfy the homeowners. Councilman Gookin said that overall, he thinks that the project was exemplary and thanked Mr. Remitz for his efforts.

MOTION: Motion by Councilman Gookin, seconded by Councilman Goodlander, to recommend council approval of Resolution No. 13- authorizing Change Orders No. 1 and No. 2 in the amount of \$4,210.36 to the Agreement with MDM Construction, Inc. for the construction of the 2013 Open Trench Project, for a total construction amount of \$359,291.62. Motion carried.

Item 2 Request by Bob Erickson, 3982 Nettleton Gulch, for Service Outside City Limits

Consent Calendar

Terry Pickel, Assistant Water Superintendent, presented a request from Mr. Bob Erickson of 3982 Nettleton Gulch for water services due to a failing well.

Mr. Pickel stated in his staff report that Mr. Erickson approached the Water Department in 2012 to apply for water service due to a failing well. He was informed at that time that as his property was currently outside of city limits, unless there was a prior right through Idaho Water, he could not be granted service unless he were to annex into the city. Unfortunately, Mr. Erickson's property is not contiguous to the city limits so annexation would not be possible unless he were to gain frontage adjacent to the city limits. Mr. Erickson was ultimately not able to acquire frontage to allow annexation. With the serious lack of ground water recharge this summer, Mr. Erickson's well is currently not able to maintain sufficient production to provide the absolute essential needs of his single family dwelling.

Mr. Pickel further noted in his staff report that if Mr. Erickson's application for service is approved by the Council, he will be required to pay capitalization fees, standard hook up fees, an asphalt patching fee, and the MXU fee, for a total of \$5,167.00. This would provide service to his property line. Mr. Erickson would then be responsible for installation of the service from the meter box to his residence. Installation of the single service to Mr. Erickson's property would not impact the water system in the area as it can adequately serve the additional capacity, although Mr. Erickson will need to install and maintain a private booster pump system. Mr. Erickson would also be required to waive any opposition to future annexation and convey all water rights associated with the property to the city as a condition of service.

Mr. Pickel said that there is an Addendum to the Policy for Service Outside the City Limits that allows for a citizen to plead for a "good neighbor" policy to help them out and run service to the project. He further noted that Mr. Erickson could try to re-drill the well but it would cost him between \$30,000 and \$40,000, with no guarantee of water. He could also try to rehabilitate the well at a cost of around \$15,000, but also with no guarantee of water.

Councilman Goodlander confirmed that the city has granted this type of request in the past. Councilman Gookin asked about the water in the rest of the neighborhood. Mr. Erickson said that he didn't know about his neighbors, but he is up on a hill and his well is 620 feet deep. This time of year he is not getting anything out of it. Mr. Pickel commented that some other well owners in that area have had problems and have asked for the same thing as the area is on the edge of the aquifer. Councilman Goodlander commented that it is important to get water to them because of the potential of fire danger.

Councilman Gookin confirmed with Mr. Erickson that none of the neighbors who are close to him want to do an annexation. He also asked if this would include sewer too. Mr. Erickson stated that it would not as he is on a septic tank.

Councilman Gookin said that one of his concerns is how many others are there going to be in that area. Councilman Goodlander said that when folks don't have water, they don't have a home and since there appears to be an adequate water supply in that area she feels that there is no reason not to grant the request.

Councilman Gookin asked if this property would be automatically annexed if the other properties in the area were annexed. Mr. Pickel responded that part of the agreement is that Mr. Erickson would have to sign a waiver of annexation agreement.

MOTION by Councilman Gookin, seconded by Councilman Goodlander, that the city grant an exception to the Policy: Water Service Outside City Limits for Bob Erickson, 3982 Nettleton Gulch, and allow him to be connected to the city's water system. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 4:13 p.m.
