2018 Leaf Pickup Begins Tuesday, November 13

Please **DO NOT** include bagged leaves, garden debris, grass clippings, branches, limbs or trash. Please be alert to equipment in your neighborhood. Move any vehicles on the street to allow crews to do their work.

Please be sure that all leaves/needles are approximately one foot from the curb line to allow rainwater to drain. Street sweepers will follow crews as they move through the City.

These beacons will improve safety at a crosswalk used daily by Fernan Elementary Students. RRFBs have been shown to improve yield rates at crosswalks by up to 85%.

Downtown Parking Garage Opens in December

The new downtown parking garage that began construction in January is almost complete and will be open for use beginning in December. Located on the south side of Coeur d'Alene Avenue between 3rd Street and 4th Street, the new 4 1/2 story parking structure will provide approximately 350 additional parking spaces for downtown visitors and business employees. Access for general public use is located on Coeur d'Alene Avenue. Approximately 90 spaces are provided for monthly pass holders through a secured entrance on 3rd Street. Wayfinding signage is being installed in the area to direct motorists to the new parking garage as well as the McEuen parking. Up to two retail storefronts are available on 3rd Street. The parking garage design was completed by Miller-Stauffer Architects with construction by T. LaRiviere. Funding was provided by ignite cda.
