In The News Live Find Certification

In early February, Firefighter/Paramedic Scott Robinson and K9 Joe passed their Live Find Certification evaluation in California. Live Find Certification is a rigorous certification in urban search and rescue. Handlers and canine teams are tested on search strategies, tactics, mapping, victim markings and canine handling skills.

The certification is nationally recognized. Both Firefighter/Paramedic Robinson and K9 Joe are part of the Idaho Disaster Dog Search and Rescue Team, as well as the Washington Task Force 1 Urban Search and Rescue.

Spring Start Up – Irrigation Backflow Assemblies

Landscape irrigation systems make watering lawns and gardens convenient and save time, but water that may be contaminated can potentially be back-siphoned or backflow into your drinking water.

To protect your drinking water from potential contamination by weed killers, pesticides, animal waste, or fertilizers, it is important to have an approved backflow prevention assembly/device properly installed on your landscape irrigation system. It is equally important to be certain this backflow prevention assembly is performance tested annually to ensure that it is functioning properly. Annual backflow assembly testing is required by the State of Idaho and by City ordinance.

Irrigation backflow assemblies must be tested annually at spring irrigation start up and no later than July 1st of each calendar year. This test, performed by a private - state licensed backflow assembly tester, verifies that the backflow prevention assembly is functioning properly.

A landscape irrigation system not protected by an approved backflow prevention assembly, or protected by an assembly that is not functioning correctly, endangers the health of the household, neighborhood, and the entire community.



Free ADU Plans

Free, Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) approved plans, sponsored by Housing Solutions Partnership are now available. Kootenai County has a shortage of housing for local workers. Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) — also known as granny flats, in-law suites, backyard cottages and Accessory Living Units (ALUs) — offer a practical solution to help address these challenges.

The <u>four plan sets available</u> were reviewed by building department heads and planners from local municipalities. These plans are **FREE** for use in Kootenai County, Idaho.

When applying for an ADU Permit in Coeur d'Alene, be sure to include required City of <u>Coeur d' Alene Building Application</u>, <u>ADU</u> <u>Application</u>, Site Plan, Truss and HVAC information. Approved plans do not include site plans or lot coverage plans. Each site must comply with both the site's zoning standards and the ADU standards.



Free ADU Plans, cont.

Please Note: If an ADU is approved for a property, a majority owner is required to occupy either the principal dwelling unit or the ADU if one of the units is to be used as a short-term rental. Both units may not be used as short-term rentals.

While the pre-approval process will help expedite the review by the Building Department, the ADU permit applications will still need to be routed to other departments to ensure code compliance. There is no charge for the use of the plan sets; however, there will be building permit fees, impact fees and capitalization fees for water and wastewater associated with the ADU permit.
